The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9 AM on Tuesday, September 16th, 2014, with Bob Beck, Jim Cary and Tom Broeker present.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions carried.

Meet with Department Heads: County Engineer Brian Carter reported that crews were working to complete projects before winter. County Recorder Lisa Schreiner reported that she has been checking into converting microfilm in her office to computer files. She received a quote of \$80,000. She and the County Auditor are considering purchasing a machine together with current staff doing the conversion. Chief Deputy Jeff White reported that Burlington Police Department and DesCom are planning a structure upgrade for the radio tower and upgrades on the radios. They have been approved for a grant for body cameras and are waiting to receive the money. Community Services Director Ken Hyndman reported that he and representatives of Hope Haven and Great River Mental Health will speak at the ISAC conference regarding the County's crisis center.

Correspondence received and filed: a letter from Duane Worthy, as council member of Danville City Council. Worthy is not in favor of the fireworks permit for the Danville football home game and asked that the Supervisors not approve it.

Public Input Session #1: Kenton Cole, Danville, stated that he is not opposed personally to the fireworks but as a City Councilman. He said that the noise was not startling at the care center but startled two residents on Trulaine Drive with heart conditions. That is why he voted against the application. Jerry Strause, Danville, stated that he voted in favor of the fireworks permit because of team spirit. He was within forty feet of the blast and didn't think it was too loud. Cary suggested that Danville City Council hold another emergency meeting. Cole said that too many councilpersons were out of town to have a quorum before Friday's homecoming game. Broeker stated that he thought Danville City should settle this and not involve the county. Strause replied that a lot of the Football Moms reside in the county.

Accounts Payable Claims in the amount of \$655,236.13 were approved upon motion by Cary and second by Broeker.

Jeff Hanan, Land Use Administrator, presented the Final Plat and Resolution for Hickory Crest Subdivision, a 10 lot subdivision off Beaverdale Road in Flint River Township. Hanan stated that the Zoning Commission approved this subdivision subject to the owners of adjoining properties signing off on the fence agreement. Ed and Joyce Blow, 12268 158th Ave., West Burlington, want a 47 inch tall fence built to specifications in the Ordinance. Developer Craig Upton is offering a 39 inch fence. Marvin and Sheila Hulett didn't sign the fence waiver because they are opposed to the development. They are worried about additional runoff and increased erosion.

Because the Board didn't receive any information about this issue before Monday, September 15th, Cary moved to table until they received more information. Beck responded that the principals were present to give more information. The motion died for lack of second.

Craig Upton, 11927 Beaverdale Road, stated that nine new homes of the style that will be built will bring much needed tax revenue to the county. Upton said that the primary reason for a fence agreement is livestock. There hasn't been any livestock on Blow's property for years. Blow replied that Upton is willing to build 500 feet of new fence to correct the property line because Upton will gain 15 feet of land. Blow wants the fence to keep people off his property so he wants a fence along the full length.

Dale Oaks, 13419 Beaverdale Road, stated that the fence agreement was written years ago at his request. He has been in this situation two separate times. Oaks said that the fence agreement states that the developer pays for the entire fence. Broeker asked that Upton and Blow reach an agreement before submitting the subdivision again. Beck added that Upton is increasing the value of his property and devaluing Blow's property.

Broeker moved to table the subdivision until September 23rd meeting. Cary seconded.

Dan Eberhardt, Regional Planning, was present to discuss a Resolution to contribute local match funds to the

Great River Housing Trust Fund. Eberhardt stated that the money is used for down payment assistance for low income families. Twenty-two families were helped during the previous year. Cary moved to contribute \$10,000 to the trust fund. Seconded by Broecker. Money was budgeted for this purpose.

WHEREAS, DES MOINES COUNTY residents and businesses have benefitted economically through sustained taxes and supply purchasing through the Great River Housing Trust Fund's Programs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE DES MOINES COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THAT:

DES MOINES COUNTY will contribute \$10,000 cash match to the Great River Housing Trust Fund thus benefiting low to moderate income households in the county and region.

County Engineer Brian Carter reported bid results for FEMA project DR-4187. The project consists of removing tree limbs from under bridges in four locations. Doug Beckman was low bidder on Sites 1, 2, and 3. Fye Excavating was awarded the bid on Site #4. The project is slated to be completed by December 7th.

A fireworks permit for Danville Football was discussed. Beck stated that football is a big deal in Danville. The train going through town multiple times a day is much louder than the discharge of fireworks. Cary stated that the permit was requested by county residents and the shoot location is in the county. Cary moved to approve the permit. Seconded by Broeker for discussion, which ensued. Beck moved to amend the original motion to approve the permit for one event only. Seconded by Broeker. Vote was unanimous. Vote on the original motion was also unanimous. The discharge will actually be a stadium concussion, not fireworks.

Broeker had attended a SEIL Governance meeting, a Grow Greater Burlington meeting, and a COBCO meeting, where four finalists were interviewed for the broker consultant position. Beck had attended a noon luncheon with SEIPRC.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:54 AM.
