March 17th, 2020

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9 AM on Tuesday, March 17th, 2020, with Chairman Tom Broeker, Vice-Chair Jim Cary and Member Bob Beck present.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted. Under Changes to the Tentative Agenda – Chairman Broeker moved Other Business to Item 5(A) Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency.

Meet with Department Heads: County Auditor Terri Johnson reported the State has informed County Auditor's the filing dates for candidates will not change due to the Coronavirus situation. Encouraged voters to request absentee ballots for Primary Election. Assessor Matt Warner stated the deadline for sending notices out is April 1st for any change of value. Property owners can ask for informal review April 2nd thru April 25th and the formal appeal option is April 2nd thru April 30th with the local Board of Review. Jail Administrator Doug Ervine reported 74 inmates. IT Director Colin Gerst reported the State is pushing counties to move their website and email addresses to .gov due to spam and phishing issues. County Engineer Brian Carter reported the Gear Avenue project will be starting on Wednesday and the annual rock haul should start today. Budget Director Cheryl McVey reminded everyone the FY21 County budget hearing is next week. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter reported they have received a few land use inquiries. Veterans Affairs Director Bob Housewright reported the new assistant in the office is working well. Others present: County Recorder Lisa Hazell, CDS Director Ken Hyndman, Maintenance Supervisor Rodney Bliesener, County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist, Public Health Administrator Christa Poggemiller, Safety Director Angie Vaughan, Sheriff Mike Johnstone, Chief Deputy Brett Grimshaw, County Attorney Lisa Schaefer, Conservation Director Chris Lee, Emergency Management Director Gina Hardin and Judge Kruse.

Coronavirus. The Board discussed with all Departments the current pandemic situation and the need to cut down or eliminate walk-in traffic and do as much business as possible by phone, email or online. Each department discussed documents that could be taken care of thru other processes and if anyone needs face to face contact, they will need to make an appointment to enter the courthouse thru the required department. Judge Kruse stated all jury trials and criminal cases are suspended until April 20th, , civil cases until May. No small claims trials and certain written guilty plea felony cases. The District and Associate judges are working to reduce the court traffic. Chief Judge Brown will be talking to the Judicial Counsel and Supreme Court for guidance. Judge Kruse stated a lot is being done and will continue to change the next few days. County Attorney Lisa Schaefer stated bench simple demeanor trials are still taking place but could change. Discussed getting drop off boxes for the public for tax payments, license payments, fine payments, paperwork, absentee ballot requests, etc. Phone line availability was also discussed, and Cary was concerned not everyone had internet and the County will have to provide for walk-ins. They will need to be screened before entering or on the phone before making an appointment with a department. After much discussion, and motion suggestions Beck motioned to have the County Attorney write a policy to limit access to county buildings by appointment only, seconded by Cary. Broeker asked the policy to be written by Wednesday morning for a special meeting. Broeker suggested to have future meetings electronically. IT Department will work on live streaming the meetings and pubic availability to email or call in to the meetings. Cary motioned to start having electronic meetings effective Wednesday morning March 18th at 9AM and seconded by Beck. Twenty-four-hour notice of the special meeting is not required due to emergency situation.

Accounts Payable Claims in the amount of \$667,393.50 was presented. Beck motioned to approve and seconded by Cary.

The Auditor presented a resolution to place a question on the November Election ballot for the remaining townships electing their township officials and giving them the option to have them appointed. In 2006 the question was on the ballot for all townships and six of those townships chose to have their officials appointed. Beck motioned to approve the placement of the question on the November ballot and seconded by Cary.

RESOLUTION #2020-016
APPOINTMENT OF TOWNSHIP CLERKS AND TRUSTEES

WHEREAS, Section 39.22, Code of Iowa, authorizes the Board of Supervisors to direct the County Commissioner of Elections to submit to the qualified electors of a township the question of whether to appoint the officers of the township, namely the Township Clerk and the Township Trustees, rather than to have them elected; and

WHEREAS, said Board of Supervisors approves placing the following question on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot; "Shall the Des Moines County Board of Supervisors fill the offices of Trustees and Clerk of ______Township by appointment as the terms of office of the incumbent township officers expire? Yes or No" to the qualified electors in the following townships: Benton, Concordia, Huron, Jackson, Pleasant Grove and Washington;

WHEREAS, if approved by a majority of the qualified electors of those townships; their township officers will be appointed by the Board of Supervisors instead of placing the positions on the ballot of a general election; and such appointments will be based on recommendations by the current township officers;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Des Moines County, Iowa, directs the County Auditor to place the township question on the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot.

Cary thanked all department heads and public officials for keeping everyone safe. Emergency Management Director Gina Hardin reported she has been asked by Department of Human Services to obtain information in regard to employees who work in critical infrastructure needing childcare. Hardin must have the information by 4:30 PM today. Hardin stated the President has signed an emergency declaration.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:38 AM.

Work session held after the meeting with the Board of Supervisors and Courthouse Security Committee to discuss Courthouse Security. Discussed permits to carry in the courthouse and possibly closing one entry to make the Courthouse a one entry building. The reason for the discussion is pending legislation by the state to limit local municipalities from limiting right to carry owners. Discussed metal detectors and wands to scan anyone entering the courthouse for any non-authorized weapons.
