### January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9 AM on Tuesday, January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022, with Chair Jim Cary and Vice-Chair Shane McCampbell present. Member Tom Broeker was present through Webex. This meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meet with Department Heads: Auditor Terri Johnson was present via Webex for an agenda item. IT Director Colin Gerst reported his office is busy and is working on his budget. Sheriff Kevin Glendening stated everything is going well. The jail population is at 67 with none being housed out of county. Assistant Land use Administrator Zach James stated he has an agenda item. Another minor subdivision is in the process. CDS Director Ken Hyndman reported tomorrow is the SEIL Governing Board meeting. They will be looking for a new Chairman for the Governing Board. County Engineer Brian Carter reported things are moving slowly, and it is budget review time. Due to freezing rain over the weekend, the trucks ran Sunday AM and spread some material. Motor graders ran and touched up the hills and there are slick spots. He thanked the road crew. They are preparing for snow predicted this weekend. Assistant County Attorney Trent Henkelvig reported their office is busy with trials. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist reported her office is busy. Maintenance Supervisor Rodney Bliesener reported his budget hearing is this week. His crew worked last weekend spreading material due to ice. He reminded everyone to be careful. Public Health Administrator Christa Poggemiller reported they are busy. COVID positivity cases is 125. The Health Board discussed the budget and Poggemiller gave a mosquito trapping update.

Correspondence. Member Broeker read an email he received thru Civic Plus. Laura Rappenecker, a former teacher at the former Washington School (proposed location for the new public health building), requested the Board to save the Gingko and Pine trees on the site that were planted by former students. She further stated a time capsule was also buried at the location. Discussion was held regarding a historical marker that is a rock with a plaque. This marker represents the Plank Road trail marker.

Second Public Hearing for Ordinance No. 61 – An Ordinance Establishing Voting Precincts as a result of the population changes reflected by the 2020 Census for Des Moines County, Iowa. Broeker motioned to open the public hearing and seconded by McCampbell. Auditor Johnson explained the Ordinance and it represents 17 precincts and increase by one. This is due to the county being divided into three house districts and two senate districts. The new precincts go into effect on January 15<sup>th</sup> due to Iowa Code. No comments were received. McCampbell made a motion to close the public hearing seconded by Broeker. Broeker motioned to approve the 2<sup>nd</sup> hearing and waive the third hearing and approved Ordinance 61. Seconded by McCampbell.

Approval of 2022 Board Committee Assignments were presented with revisions following being tabled last week. McCampbell motioned to approve and seconded by Broeker.

Contract for legal services with Lynch Dallas P.C. was presented. They provide personnel attorney services, and the rate will increase to \$175 per hour. The Board is happy with the services they have provided the last 7 to 8 yrs. and are still less than previous quotes. Broeker motioned to approve and seconded by McCampbell.

Approval of DHS Tax Suspension list was presented. The property taxes are suspended until the property is sold or the individual can pay. Broeker motioned to approve and seconded by McCampbell.

Approval of 28E Library Agreement was presented. This is a 10-yr. agreement to support the Burlington and Mediapolis Libraries. McCampbell motioned to approve and seconded by Broeker.

Resolution 2022-002 Appointing Ron Breuer to another five-year term on the Zoning Commission was presented. McCampbell motioned to approve and seconded by Broeker.

Resolution 2022-003 Appointing Rev. Orlando R Dial, Matt Shivers and Mary Margaret Wagner to three-

year terms on the Des Moines County Board of Health. Chairman Cary highly recommended all three to the board. Broeker motioned to approve and seconded by McCampbell.
